



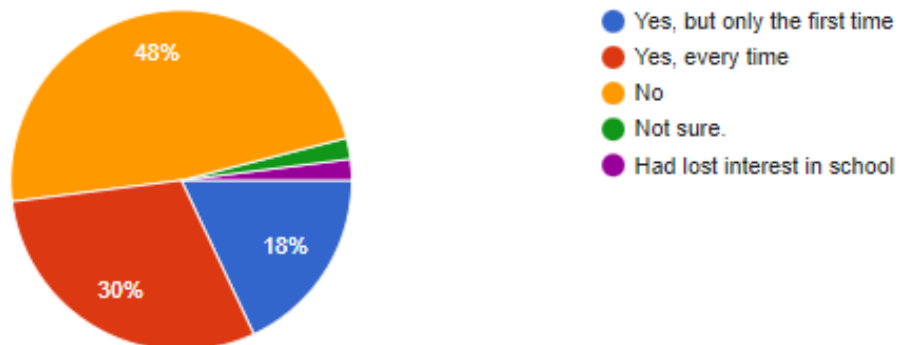

To the best of your knowledge did your son experience additional anxiety/stress when returning to school from the various lockdowns?

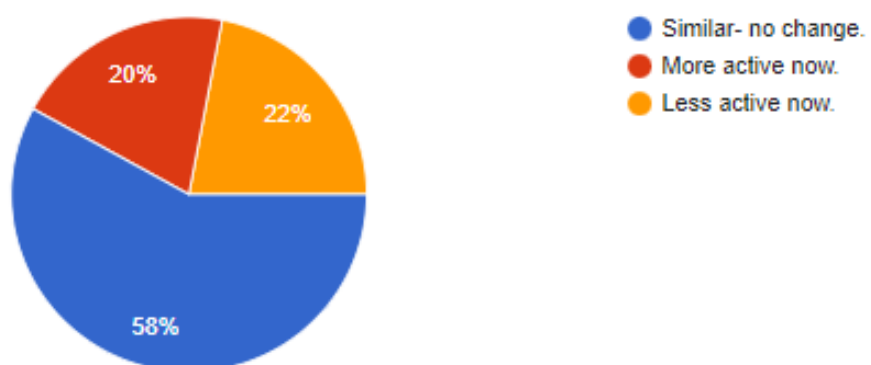

How would you compare your son's current engagement in physical activities (recreation or sport) to his engagement in these activities before the disruption caused by Covid 19?

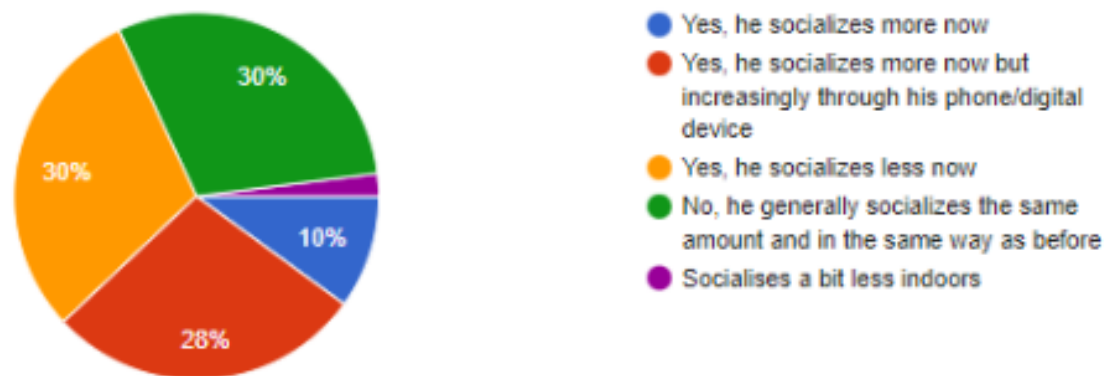

Have you noticed any differences in how your son socializes (spends time with friends) since the Covid pandemic?

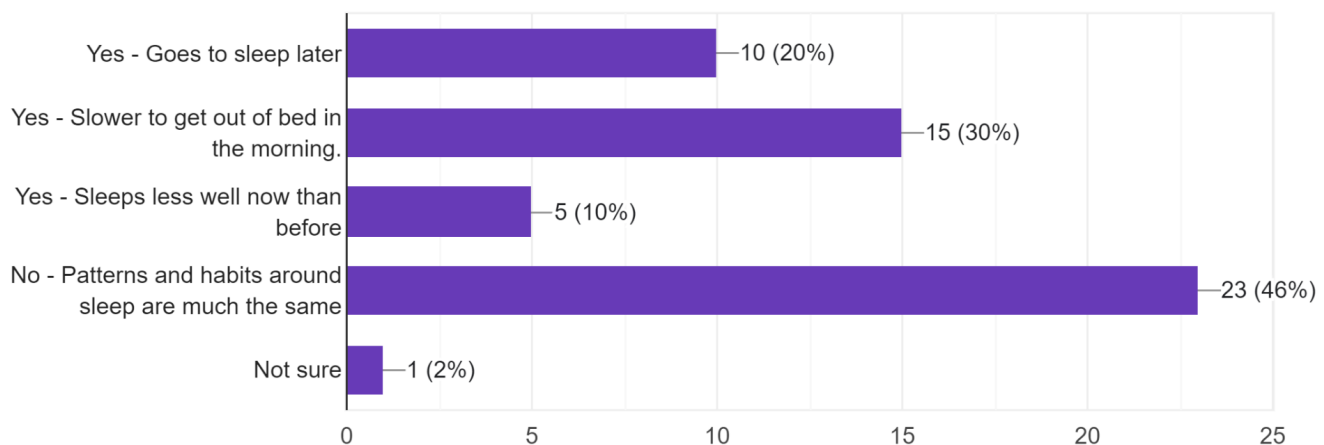

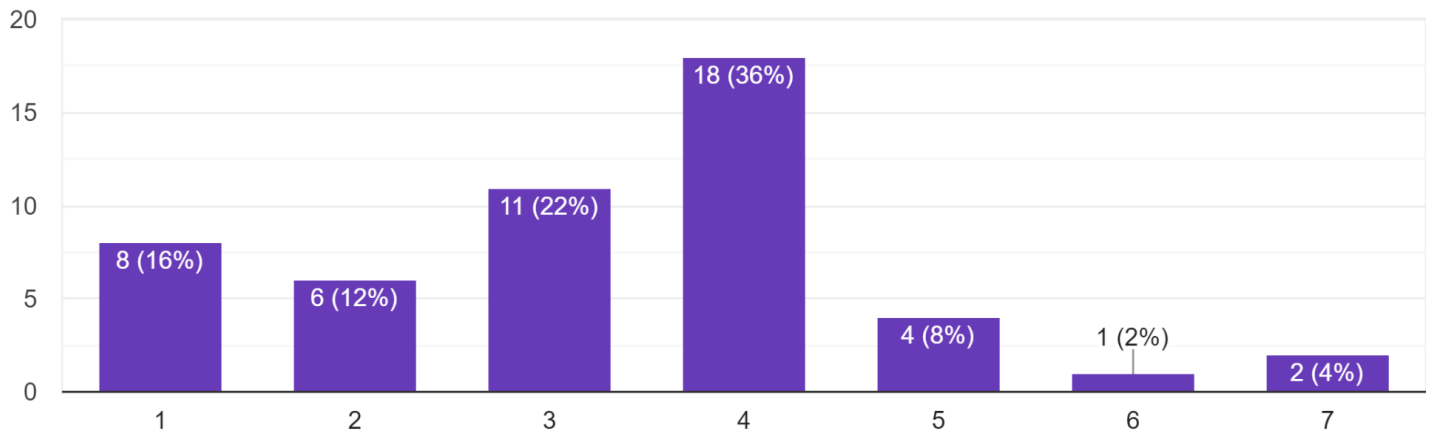


Question 5

In your opinion how has Covid 19 impacted on your son's engagement with teaching and learning?

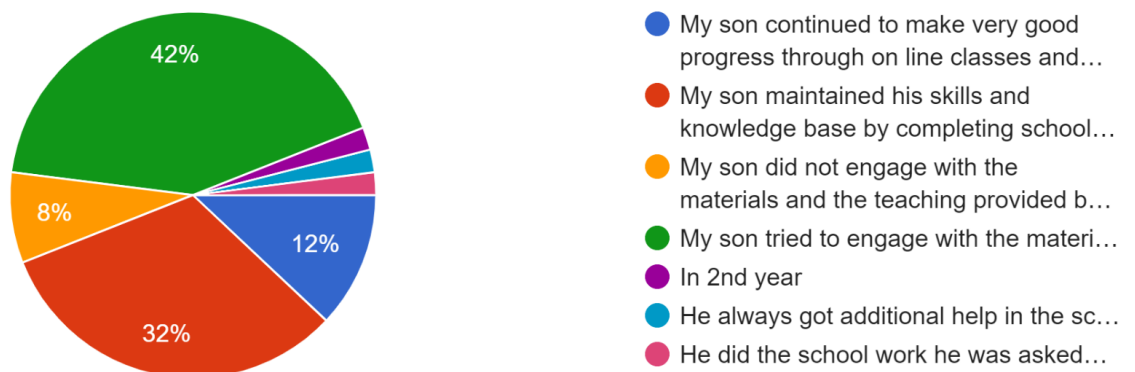

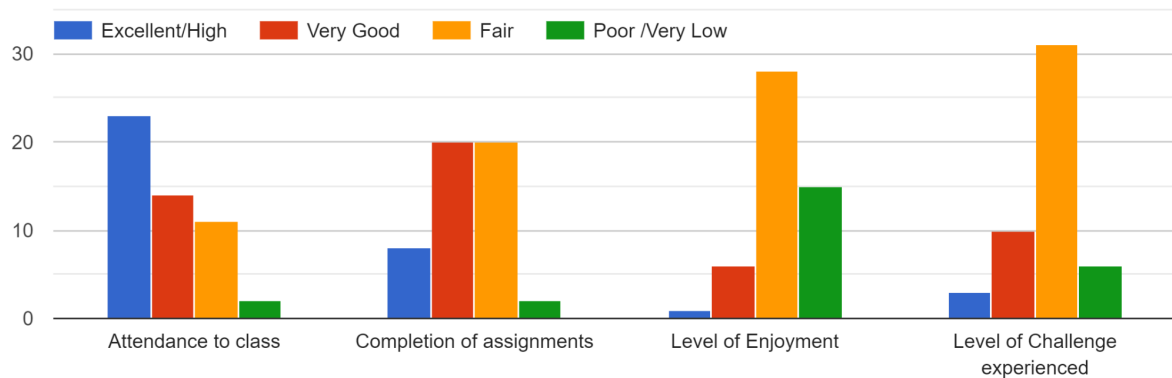
During the initial lockdown of March 2020 your son was in sixth class. Which of the following statements best describes your sons engagement with teaching and learning at that time?

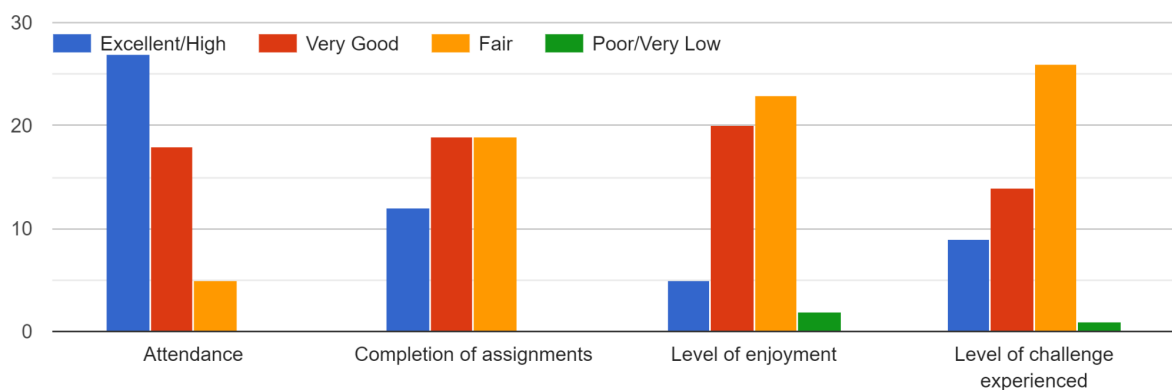
Question 7

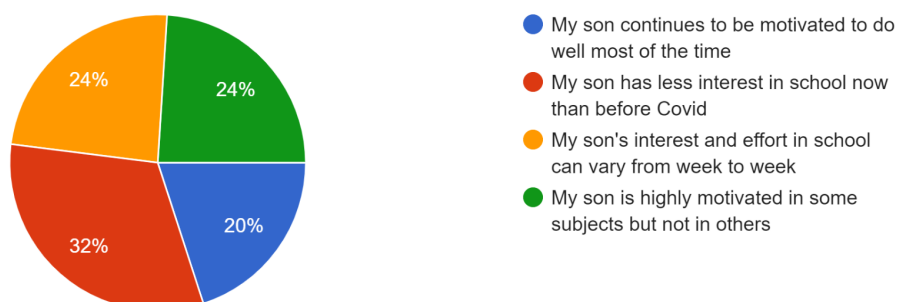
How would you rate your son's engagement in his third year at Naas CBS?(e.g. his attendance to classes and effort he makes with homework/tasks given)

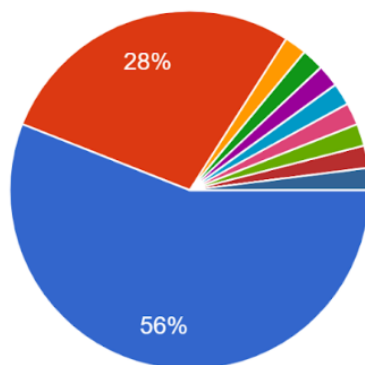


Question 11

Were you satisfied with the teaching and learning opportunities available to your son during Covid closure?

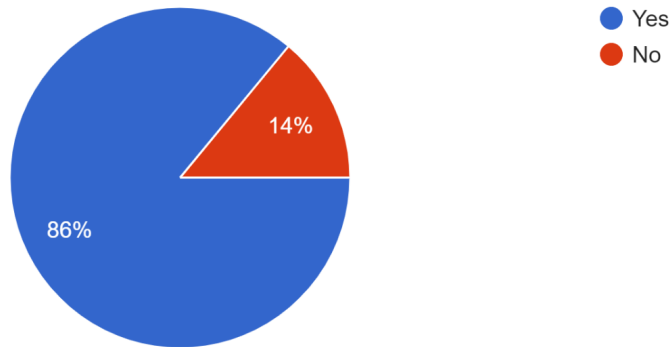

Are you satisfied that adequate supports are currently available to your son to help him return to school successfully?

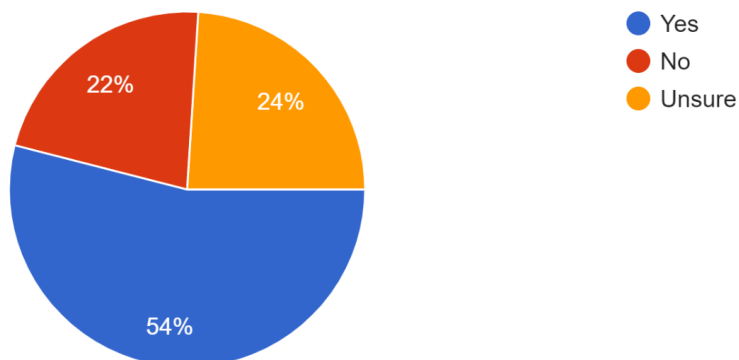

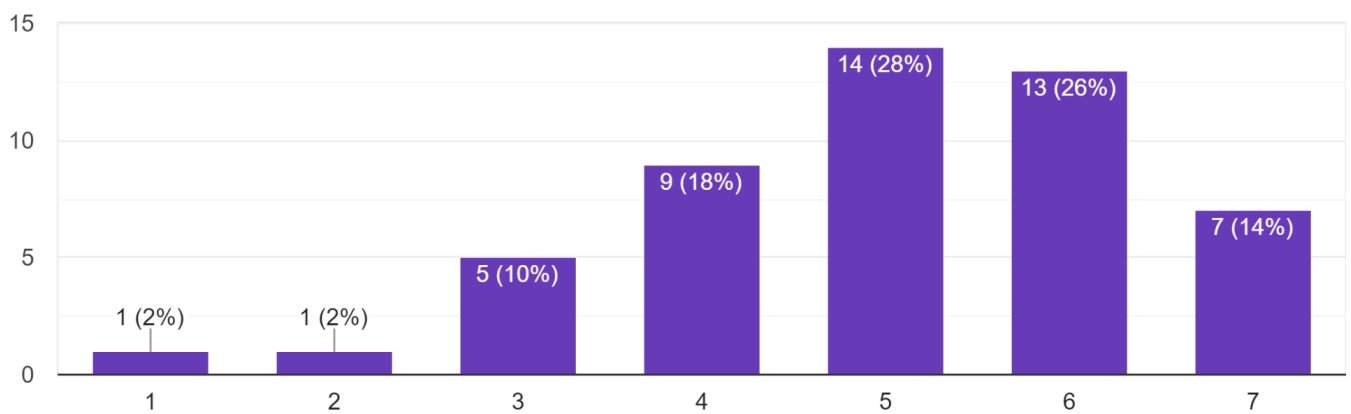
Question 14
