Rule 1. The OAL needs to be written in the third person e.g Yvonne was a member of..

Rule 2. Aim for 2 to 5 different OALS

Rule 3. No spelling/grammar mistakes and keep to wordcount.

This has developed his communication and presentation skills. It has also helped to improve his confidence.

Eddie was a member of the Gaelic football team where he won the U-16 league final. This experience highlights how well he worked in a team and his ability to self-motivate.



Michael was a member of the school choir. This developed his social and performing skills. He was also involved in a young scientist project which he had to set goals and meet deadlines.
