


#### Common Pitfalls..

## Role of Parents

#### Communication - School App

- Help student to make choices
- Prepare for selection process
- Review students involvement regularly and also familiarise with the 'Contract of Learning'
- Plan Finance

#### Policy on Entry Refer to detailed School Policy Document

- Maximum number .. Subject to annual review by BoM.
  - Maximum for September 2018 was 144 boys.
  - Maximum for September 2019 was 149 boys.
  - Maximum for September 2020 was 150 boys.
- Current Students in Naas CBS will have first call on places -Terms & Conditions apply.
- Outside applicants will be dealt with on a first come first served basis.
- Selection committee will be appointed by the Principal
- Factors to be taken into account will include:
  - School record .. Interview .. Age of Applicant .. Special Education Needs
- School record looks at .. Attendance / Punctuality / Application to Work / Conduct throughout the school.
- Individuals subject teachers will be requested to grade each applicant's suitability for TY.
- All applicants will undergo Interview for entry .. Initial interviews will take place in small groups.

#### Policy on Entry Continued Refer to detailed School Policy Document

- Selection Committee will have regard to Special Education Needs of students in assessing the students application.
- Those applicants who are refused may appeal to an Appeals Committee comprising the Principal, Deputy Principal and the Year Head for Third Year. (The decision of this Committee will be final)
- Where Parents believe that these procedures were not followed correctly, they will have a right of Appeal to the Board of Management.

#### Finance

• Transition Year Fee will be approximately - €450

• Optional Extra - End of Year Trip - €200 (Approximately)
